Current context: Face-to-face teaching

All students and myself have a responsibility to keep ourselves, each other, close family members and other users of the teaching venue(s) as safe as possible.

With this aim in mind, everyone (no exceptions) attending my face-to-face classes and/or workshops is required:

- To have received both Covid 19 vaccinations.
- To have received all booster vaccinations as and when they become available.
- Upon request by me or a venue representative, to provide evidence of vaccination.
- To have a negative lateral flow test result within the preceding 24 hours of any of my face-to-face classes/workshops.
- Upon request by me or a venue representative, to provide evidence of the negative lateral flow test result. This will be the email you receive in response to registering your test result with <https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result>, either a paper version you bring from home, the email on your phone/tablet or the entry in your Covid Pass (NHS App).
- To not attend a class/workshop if you have a family member(s) at home isolating because they have tested positive, even if you have tested negative.
- To not attend a class/workshop if you feel at all unwell.

General points:

- Face coverings are optional at my face-to-face classes/workshops.
- Use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Wipe down your work area before/after use. Surface wipes/cleaner will be provided.
- Assuming the kitchen can be used, bring your own mug and wipe down kitchen surfaces before/after use. Surface wipes/cleaner will be provided.
- Bring your own mug.
- Bring a cardigan for the winter months as it's likely windows/doors will be open to facilitate greater air flow through the venue.
- Social distancing measures required by the venue will be followed.
- Lateral flow test kits for home use are available to order online via <https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests>.
